Roger Leroy Boose, 60, died from pancreatic cancer on Sunday, January 31 at 4:50 p.m. at his residence. He took his last breaths while holding his wife's hand and his son nearby. Compassionate Care Hospice was in attendance and helped him pass more comfortably.

He was the husband of Kathleen "Kelly" L. (McCarthy) Boose of Red Lion and father of Mycroft Strummer Boose. He was born in Westminster, Md. on September 19, 1955 and was the son of the late Roger A. and Violet (Mann) Boose.
